¹⁶From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. Verse¹⁷So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! Verse¹⁸All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; Verse¹⁹that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. Verse²⁰So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. Verse²¹For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

DEVOTION

New creation. This phrase is perhaps familiar, or not. We hear it when a child or an adult is baptized. Maybe we hear it occasionally in a sermon. We certainly hear it in Paul's letters. But what is it? The last couple of days, God's promise has been the focal point of these devotions. God's promise opens up or introduces us into God's renewal of creation. Through the promise—God's steadfast love always offered—God invites us into new creation. God invites us into God's on–going activity, which is reconciling the world, reconciling all humanity, all creation to God's self. We are invited to participate in this work—to be ministers of reconciliation. Don't hide behind the walls created by society, whether they be boundaries of race, gender, class, etc. Living in those categories is old creation. God always invites us into the new beginnings of freedom, love of neighbor, and care of creation.

PRAYER

God of disruption, you break down the barriers that divide; your promise reconciles all peoples. Dismantle within us all those barriers we build, so that your good intent, your new creation, may be revealed. Amen.

Council Meeting-March 9th, 2025: Members Present: Mike, Walter, Kirstin, Kris, Sharon, and Emma. Also present Pastor Jaime.

Kris called the meeting to order at 6:36. Pastor Jaime opened with devotions and prayer.

Adopt the agenda: Kirstin made a motion. Mike seconded it.

Secretary's Report: Kirstin read the report. Sharon made a motion to approve. Walter seconded it.

Pastor's Report: *March 2nd was the annual meeting, *March 3rd was the final book study session. Starting a new book-<u>Midnight Library</u>, and it will be discussed in one meeting on Tuesday, April 22nd at 6:30pm. All are welcome to join. *March 5th -Ash Wednesday and the start of Lent and Wednesday evening services with the theme, "Unbroken: A Living Faith." The theme for Sundays is "Broken and Beloved: Stories of God's Steadfast Love." *March 6th was the funeral service for Myrna Anderson *March 11th is the Worship and Music Committee meeting *March 12th is a YOGA meeting. *GASP will continue until the end of April *Confirmation students are working on service projects and devotion/reflections with their mentors. Church Work Groups:

We are in the process of giving away the daycare supplies that we got free from the city years ago and are taking up storage space. We need to check on our geothermal system to see if it is turned on.

Men's Group-(Walter)-Lutefisk Supper supplies are still in hallway. Walter and Mike will put them into the storage unit after meeting. Brat and Burger Feed needs to be discussed and scheduled.

YOGA-(Emma)-Krista Peterson and Auston Creech are leaders. YOGA plans on meeting every other Wednesday evening.

Education-(Emma)-GASP ends in April and SS ends on April 13th. SS will choose the way to spend the Make a Change Offering from the ELCA Good Gifts catalog.

Altar Guild-(Kirstin)-Meets the last Sun. of each month after worship. Polishing silver in March.

Worship and Music-(Paul)-No report

New Business: *Lutefisk Supper was discussed at the annual meeting and will now be a church wide event. A committee is being formed, led by Walter, Sharon, and Mike with multigenerational and diverse members to discuss what change will take place.

*GA Foundation Committee asked if there were church building repairs or plans. Kris suggested adding a bigger door and handicap accessible men's bathroom. This was tabled.

Nominations: Kirstin nominated Martin for president, Walter nominated Kirstin for Vice President, and Sharon nominated Emma for Secretary. Walter made a motion to cast a unanimous ballot. Emma seconded it. Motion carried.
