


<u>Peace of the Prairie A Liturgy for Here and Now</u>

Invocation

Grace and peace to you from the God of Shalom, who creates, claims, and calls you for here and now. **Amen.**

Gathering Song: The Earth with Heaven's Music Rings



Gathering Prayer

God of every time and every place, by your Spirit we have been gathered from the rhythms and rituals of daily life to remember who and whose we are. Guide our attention to the here and now, so that we take root like lilies of the field and spread our wings like birds of the air, restored by your provision and peace. **Amen.**

Litany: We Remember

The Christian faith asks us to hold many truths in tension with one another. We plant our feet on Dakota land, on layers of soil and stories and acknowledge that people and places contain multitudes.

We remember

the generous gifts of creation and God's promise of enough.

We remember

glacial melt, the birth pangs of prairie, ancestors singing, Water is Life!

We remember

acres sold and treaties breaking, settlers unsettling and systems taking.

We remember

the legacy and loss of bison, of nations oppressed and removed.

We remember

the isolation of immigration, homesteads far from new neighbors and old country.

We remember

Dakota people already and not yet, and resilient voices in this generation.

We remember

farmers who labor to feed the world, who know wind and weather in their bones.

We remember

the call to turn from the myth of scarcity, to interrupt patterns of harm with justice.

We remember

we belong to each other and to this land, all relations of the God who re-members.

Re-member us, O God. Amen.

Reading: Ecclesiastes 3:1-8

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace.

While singing the refrain of the next song, you might hold your hands out with your palms up. May this ancient posture for prayer connect your brain and your body.

Centering Song: Here and Now



Gospel Reading: Matthew 6:25-34

Whether you read the scripture passage and guiding questions silently or aloud, whether you share in small groups or reflect in solitude, may this time inspire a deep awareness of God's provision.

Jesus said, "This is why I am telling you not to be troubled about getting enough to eat or drink, or what to wear. Is eating, drinking, and clothing yourself all there is? Does your life not have more meaning than this?

What is troubling you today?

Look to the winged ones who soar on the wind. Do they plant seeds and gather the harvest into a storehouse? No! But your Father from above gives them plenty to eat. Do you not know that Creator cares even more for you? Can worry add even one more step to the length of your life's journey? Why do you trouble yourself with what to wear? Have you seen how the wildflowers grow in the plains and meadows? Do you think they work hard and long to clothe themselves? No! I tell you not even the great chieftain Stands in Peace, Solomon, wearing his finest regalia was dressed as well as even one of these. If Creator covers the wild grass in the plains with such beauty, which is here today and gathered for tomorrow's fire, will Creator not take even better care of you?

What image or phrase is God using here to get your attention?

Why is your faith so small? There is no need to say what will we eat? What will we drink? What will we wear? This is what the Nations who have lost their way have given their heart to. But your Father from above knows you need these things.

What is it that God knows you need today?

If you will make Creator's good road your first aim and represent these ways, Creator will make sure you have all you need for each day. So do not worry about tomorrow's troubles. It is enough to trust Creator to give you the strength you need to face today."

How might you respond to God's invitation to be here and now?

God of the winged ones and the wildflowers, by your living word you call us valuable and promise what we need to live abundantly. Renewed by your presence and provision, we offer our whole selves to this time and place, trusting it is enough because you say it is so. **Amen.**
