

# <u>Palm/Passion Sunday</u> Gustaf Adolf Lutheran Church April 13<sup>th</sup>, 2025

Through our ritual practice during Holy Week, as we parade with palms singing hosanna, wash one another's feet, share in the Lord's Supper, strip the altar, and gather around the cross, we bring this millennia old story into the present day. Through our participation in these acts, we make this story our story. As we hear the story of Christ's journey from death to life, we tell the story of our own journey from death to new life with Christ and in the community of the church.

When we read these stories in the midst of the liturgies and rituals that connect our stories to the story of God's saving work in Jesus Christ, the glimpses of God's eternal love crack through this story of betrayal, tragedy, and death.

While our liturgies and rituals this week make this story our story, we - as Christians living 2000 years after these historical events - always live on the other side of the empty tomb. Our invitation is not to despair as the disciples, but to remember that any time we hear of despair, death, or injustice, God is there working to make eternal life for all creation. Holy Week calls us then to turn our attention and go to these places of despair, death, and injustice so that the stories of our lives may join God's story in witnessing to the power of life and love, even in the midst of death.

## **Confession & Forgiveness**

Through your divine love, transform all that threatens to destroy the good that you have created.

Beloved people of God: At a table that Jesus sets, God forgives us and feeds us with love eternal. In water and promise, God brings us to new life

and breathes into us gifts to serve the world. You are forgiven, in the name of Christ (+), who calls us into the coming of God's reign where all are supported, nourished, and loved. Amen.
