<u>Psalm 34:15-22</u>

¹⁵The eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are open to their cry. Verse¹⁶The face of the Lord is against evildoers, to cut off the remembrance of them from the earth. Verse¹⁷When the righteous cry for help, the Lord hears, and rescues them from all their troubles. Verse¹⁸The Lord is near to the brokenhearted, and saves the crushed in spirit. Verse¹⁹Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but the Lord rescues them from them all. Verse²⁰He keeps all their bones; not one of them will be broken. Verse²¹Evil brings death to the wicked, and those who hate the righteous will be condemned. Verse²²The Lord redeems the life of his servants; none of those who take refuge in him will be condemned.

Council Meeting – August 25th, 2024, Members present: Kris, Paul, Sharon, Austen, Martin, Mike, and Kirstin. Others present: Pastor Jaime and Jericho Qualley

Kris called the meeting to order. Devotion and Prayer led by: Pastor Jaime

Approve agenda: Austen/Paul Secretary's Report: Martin/Mike

Pastor's Report: Summer Reading Camp was held throughout July with 12 kids attending. VBS was led by Jericho Qually and Kaleb Brockman with 17 attending. Christmas in July was held July 21st and the YOGA canoe trip had 11 kids attend with 4 adult leaders. In August there was a Baptism and a funeral service. Coming in September is the EaND Fall Pastor Conference, 2 Baptisms, Castaways Youth Retreat, and a wedding which will be held in Wahpeton.

Church Work Groups:

1. Property and Grounds: There are jobs that need to be done before winter such as raise/lower sump pump, add heat tape, scrape and paint windows, window washing, and cleaning the gutters. On Sunday, Sept. 22nd we will have a gathering in the church for a short service, followed by a GA clean up day, and afterwards a meal will be provided by the council members.

2. WELCA: They will meet in the fall. Items to discuss are updating the WELCA book and discuss deep cleaning of the church by the work groups.

3. Men's Group: No report.

4. YOGA: Leaders and members meet on August 25th to plan their year.

5. Education: (This info. is under New Business)

6. Altar Guild: Meetings are now changed to the last Sunday of the month following church. Dennis is starting to make the new Baptismal font.

7. Worship and Music: No report

Old Business: Kris is looking into quotes for the west door in the Fellowship Hall which needs to be replaced. She will call Red River Glazing for a steel door.

New Business: 1) Grotberg inspected the furnace and replaced a pressure gauge. 2) New approach to teach Sunday School was proposed by Pastor Jaime, as the traditional way is not working. It would involve our H.S. youth as paid positions. They would be under contract teaching a new curriculum for a 7 week session which includes attending church first. This idea came from a pastor in VA that has had excellent results. Paul made a motion to try this new Sunday School style and pay each youth \$15/hr. Martin seconded it. 3) Daycare discussion was proposed. Jericho Qualley gave us her background in daycare. There is a great need in our community and the council would like to help with that problem by renting out our building as a proposed site. It would start small, and when Jericho gets licensed, it could lead to a larger daycare with more employees. GA would waive the first couple months of rent while Jericho gets the daycare up and running, but after that a lease would be written up. There will be a church discussion on this following the service on September 15th. A preliminary motion was made to approve the daycare made by Kirstin. Martin seconded it. 4) GA plans on starting an elementary After School Program in October. We received a grant from Waste Management that will cover costs. The focus will be on homework help and music instruction, taught by Indy Husted. This is a paid position, and we are proposing \$25/ hr. Volunteer helpers will be needed for the homework help time. Two sessions of music will be held, which alternate with the homework time. Paul, Kirstin, Kris, and Pastor Jaime will meet as a committee for further planning. 5) Pastor Jaime is contemplating changing the style and years of confirmation. She has the council's full backing to try something new. Paul made a motion and Mike seconded it.

Treasurer's Report: Paul made a motion to accept and Mike seconded it.

Adjourn: Mike/Paul Lord's Prayer Next meeting is September 11th
