Steve Jacobson, 79, a lifelong Gwinner, ND area farmer & business owner passed away on Thursday, August 22, 2024, at Parkside Lutheran Home, Lisbon, ND under the comfort care of Hospice Red River Valley.

Steve Harold Jacobson, was a faithful husband, loving father, grandfather and great-grandfather. There are two ways to raise a family and farm - the wrong way and Steve's way. Work is fun! Steve had fun! He loved playing cards, watching old western TV shows and he enjoyed teasing and having fun joking around.

The oldest son of Harold & Anna Jacobson, Steve grew up on the family farm, farmed the land, and continued to spend time at the farm until his death.
